Keep jewellery to a minimum. Anything that calls undue attention to itself should be left at home.

Dressing To The Position Dressing to the position for which you're interviewing is tricky. Many companies have a business casual style of dress in the office. You may be tempted to try fitting into the office work environment by dressing casually. Remember, being more conservative in your clothing during the interview is always a good idea. If the person who is going to interview you arrives dressed casually, you can easily adjust by removing your jacket or loosening your tie.
